Eclipse Callisto Released

The Eclipse foundation released 10 projects in a coordinated drop this month. It includes:

- Business Intelligence and Reporting Tools (BIRT) 2.1
- C/C++ IDE (CDT) 3.1
- Data Tools Platform (DTP) 1.0
- Eclipse Modeling Framework (EMF) 2.2
- Graphical Editor Framework (GEF) 3.2
- Graphical Modeling Framework (GMF) 1.0
- Eclipse Project 3.2
- Test and Performance Tools Platform (TPTP) 4.2,
- Web Tools Platform (WTP) 1.5
- Visual Editor (VE) 1.2.
