Brian Pontarelli is the founder of Inversoft, a Colorado based software company, the director of technology at the Chicago based start-up Naymz, and the founder of the Savant and Java.net commons open source projects. In the past, he was the president of the Chicago Java User Group and an enterprise architect for Orbitz.

Brian has been programming many years and works primarily with Java and Ruby. He has published various articles in both print and online magazines about Java, J2EE security, Java Server Faces and NIO.
